

NATIVE PLANTS THAT WILL GROW UNDER WALNUT TREES

Walnut, *Juglans nigra*, is a beautiful but messy yard tree. Providing nuts for us and wildlife, this tree sheds branches, leaves and dangerous large, round fruits in the fall. Walnut trees produce Juglone, an allelopathic chemical that adversely affects many plants under its dripline and above its underground roots. Below are several native plants that might tolerate this toxic substance.
